## Member of the Year

FOPA Member of the year is awarded to a lodge member whose service to their lodge goes well above the norm. We received several nominations this year, and it was a tough decision for us as they are all outstanding members.

This year's member of the year has been with her lodge for around 8 years but has been supporting law enforcement long before that. Married to a law enforcement officer, she'd been supporting events at their FOP lodge before officially joining the FOPA.

She has participated in fingerprinting children at the county fair and has helped to organize several DARE events. Upon joining her FOPA lodge she immediately stepped up participating fully in all aspects of the lodge including fundraising for both her FOPA and the FOP lodges. She quickly realized the need for fresh fundraising ideas and created the FOP-FOPA purse bingo. Her idea was met with mixed reviews, people envisioned a nursing home style bingo and were skeptical about the idea. She pushed ahead organizing a small committee and raised over \$5,000 the first year! That was 5 years ago, their 5<sup>th</sup> annual Purse bingo sold out in less than two days and with over 230 people in attendance cleared over \$10,000! Her lodge president attributes the success to this member's passion for the FOPA and her incredible organizational skills.

# Lodge of the Year

FOPA Lodge of the Year is given to a lodge whose members give exceptional service to either their FOP lodge or to their community. In the case of this year's winner, they do both. Their members understand what it means to back the blue and are truly dedicated to making sure the officers as well as their families have the support they need. They are always ready and willing to help their FOP lodge in any way possible. They continue to seek members to build more support for law enforcement. And their FOP lodge supports them as well, nominating them for this honor.

They are just as devoted to serving their community. As a lodge they contribute to a local food pantry, the Stuff the Bus yearly collection for school supplies, Toys for Tots, and collect Easter basket items for the county Boys and

Girls club. They collect items and donations for the county Humane Society and the Dog Pound. They donated to a local project that supplies winter coats for kids and donate to a domestic violence shelter. They donate to OhGO and Salvation Army for events that help fight hunger. They have a yearly booth at National Touch a Truck and at a local community days celebration where they give away two bikes with helmets to local kids at each event. They donated 5 Sensory Kits to the Speech therapy department at FMRC. Their members assist FOP 17 with a community wide Trick or Treat held yearly at Cedar Point. They have a yearly fundraiser for the National Wreaths Across America and are the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest contributor for wreaths at the Ohio Veterans Home, where their members also help to lay the wreaths on the graves each year. These are just the highlights of what the members of this lodge accomplish each year. They also help their FOP lodge with their annual reverse raffle and offer support with their police memorial.

# Virgil McDaniel Award

This year we received three nominations for the Virgil McDaniel award, all three nominations were for the same member. The Virgil McDaniel award is an award the FOPA presents to an FOP member who has given exceptional service to their profession. Sometimes that means extraordinary acts of valor, or as it is with this year's recipient, it can be someone who is a hero behind the scenes. Someone who has quietly dedicated years to serving his lodge, his community, and the whole law enforcement community.

He made sure the officer's widow was put in contact with agencies that could help in her time of sorrow. He attended to every detail making sure their fallen brother was honored to the fullest, even as he was grieving the loss as well.

This is what the FOP Lodges do (name their current State Secretary). That way we can help keep track of the renewals.

If you are in need of a new membership card for a new member, or a replacement card, please *DO NOT*, repeat, *DO NOT*, email or call Denise Young. The payments made during this time period ranged from the State Conference officer expenses, liability insurance, as well as the Per Capita Payment of \$22,880 paid to the State FOP for 2,288 members. \$6,864 (\$3 per member) was paid from the General account to the Scholarship Account. At this time, we are awaiting the charges owed for the rooms for the State Conference. Once received, that bill will be paid.

A deposit of \$1,070 was made which represented the monies received from our two fund raisers – Wooden Flags and the Bourbon Baskets.

There was a deposit made in the amount of \$6,684 which represents \$3.00 per member as per our Constitution.
