FOP of Ohio Lobby Day !!!

On April 2, about 40 members of the Fraternal Order of Police of Ohio met with their state senators and representatives to discuss the legislative priorities of the FOP. We focused on pensions in both the OP-F and PERS funds; arming our state law enforcement officers at the Departments of Mental Health and Addiction Services and Developmental Disabilities; banning quotas; funding PTSD treatment; protecting collective bargaining and providing due process for officers wrongly placed on so-called Brady lists.

The position papers used will be emailed out to the membership separately for you to continue to advocate for these important issues.

FOP of Ohio participates in the National FOP Spring Board Meeting

The National FOP held their Spring Board Meeting in Salt Lake City, Utah and much of it was focused on the upcoming National Conference.

All of the National Board members will be seeking re-election and no challengers have come forward. Several Constitution amendments were proposed, as was a per capita increase was proposed. The delegates will be asked to vote on a \$3 per member increase in 2027 and a \$3 per member increase in 2030.

The National FOP is focused on the Protect and Serve Act as their next legislative priority.

Detroit, Houston and Nashville all have been deemed qualified to host the 2029 National FOP Conference and will be on the ballot for the delegates to choose from while we are in Miami Beach.




National FOP is making big changes to their training schedule


