The FOP is focused on pensions!!!

President Jay McDonald testified on HB 280, the bill to provide equity to our pension system by having employers pay the same amount for police as they do for fire. We are grateful for the support of the bill sponsors, Representatives Cindy Abrams and Thomas Hall for their efforts.

Vice President T.J. Assion testified on HB 73, to establish a DROP plan for our members in OPERS. Representatives Kevin Miller and Thomas Hall have introduced this bill at our request, and we are thankful for their hard work.

Past President of Lodge 9 Jim Gilbert testified on HB 424, a bill to rectify the issues caused by previous legislation regarding the transfer of credit for law enforcement officers between pension systems. Representative Bernard Willis and Representative Meredith Craig are the lead on this important bill and we appreciate their work to correct this wrong.

HB 473 would prohibit the bargaining for pension pickup for public employees. While rarely used, we oppose any attempt to limit our collective bargaining rights and Mike Weinman, Director of Governmental Affairs appeared on behalf o the FOP to oppose this bill.







FOP of Ohio Legislative Report

The past month has been a busy one for the legislative team, both in front of the House and Senate Committees and behind the scenes. I also testified in support of HB 492 before the House Public Safety Committee. HB 492 creates an arrestable offense for drivers who have violated Title 45 or a municipal equivalent and fail to provide their name, address, and date of birth to officers. This closes a loophole in the law that stopped officers from making an obstruction arrest for unclassified misdemeanors. President McDonald also testified on SB 188/Failure to Comply. The bill expands the offense of failure to comply with an order or signal of a law enforcement officer in the event of a barricade situation.

We have also signed onto a letter with our law enforcement coalition members in opposition to SB 270/Delinquent Children. SB 270 is another bipartisan bill that, if implemented, will exacerbate the issue law enforcement is having with juvenile defenders.

The House passed several bills: HB 132/Traffic Offenses, the bill to increase penalties for failing to slow down or change lanes when approaching specified stationary vehicles, to increase penalties for vehicular homicide and vehicular assault resulting from that offense, and to name this act Philip Wigal's Law, SB 56/Marijuana a bill to consolidate the administration of the marijuana control program, revise the medical and adult-use marijuana laws, and to levy taxes on marijuana, HB 335. Property Tax Overhaul, a bill to modify the law governing county budget commissions, property taxation, county sales taxation, and alternative apportionment formulas for local government and public library funds.

The Senate passed SB 55/OVI to amend the laws about operating a vehicle or watercraft while under the influence of marijuana and the admissibility of evidence for purposes of OVI statutes. Additionally, the Senate passed HB 23/Escaped Convict Alerts, a bill to create the escaped convict alert program, and SB 16/Traffic Laws, a bill to prohibit failing to change lanes or proceed with caution around a stationary vehicle in distress. Please note that SB 56/Marijuana is going to the conference committee, as the Senate disagreed with the changes made by the House.

November looks to be a busy month as the General Assembly will be taking the month of December off.

Thin Blue Line Update

The FOP of Ohio continues to advise members to contact the Ohio Department of Insurance to file a complaint for unpaid bills. We also continue to assist members in getting communication with TBL regarding unpaid claims that are over 90 days old.

We have asked specific questions of the Ohio Department of Insurance about what will happen if there are unpaid claims if the funds become exhausted and they continue to focus on getting claims paid and TBL still advises that all claims will be paid.

We have members telling us that TBL is still telling them that claims will be paid and some members are reporting that they have had claims paid recently. The Ohio Attorney General's Office represents the Ohio Department of Insurance in litigation against Thin Blue Line Benefits. We are aware that policyholders are reporting that Thin Blue Line Benefits is not paying medical claims. Information regarding claims payment may be relevant to the litigation. If you would like to report information regarding non-payment of claims to the Ohio Attorney General's Office, please call: Ohio Attorney General's Office, Constituent Services at (800) 282-0515. We suggest our members with unpaid bills contact both the Dept. of Insurance and the Ohio Attorney General's Office.

"We continue to advocate for our members to have all of their medical claims paid in accordance with the insurance policy that TBL had in place at the time. TBL is responsible to pay the full amount of those claims and make our members whole."

Should Ohio abolish property taxes?

Property taxes have been the hot topic in Ohio politics so far in this General Assembly. Numerous bills have been heard to lower the burden of property taxes and there is an ongoing effort to collect enough signatures to place a ban on property taxes into the Ohio Constitution.

The FOP of Ohio understands and supports the effort to help with the issue of property taxes rising faster than the rate of inflation but opposes a complete abolition of property taxes.

There are about 100 township police departments in Ohio, funded solely by property taxes. Each city gets what is called "inside millage" in property tax that is often used to pay their pension obligations. Counties use property taxes to pay for Children's Services and Devolpmentally Disabled agencies. If property taxes are eliminated, those agencies will not disappear and will be fighting for funding against Sheriff's Offices.

Eliminating property taxes will make raising the rates of what our employers pay for pensions much harder impacting retiree benefits and raises for working cops less likely.


To wrap it up succinctly, an abolition of property taxes will hurt public safety, cause layoffs and be bad for all essential services.

FOP's ticket quota ban went into effect on 9/30

The FOP initiated this bill (SB 114) in response to complaints of our members about having to engage in quotas at a few select agencies and were invited to the bill signing at the Governor's mansion!

This new law prohibits the following:

- Establishing a plan that uses a quota (a mandate of a finite number of arrests made or citations issued that an officer must meet in a specified period) as the basis for evaluating, promoting, compensating, transferring, or disciplining an officer;
- Requiring or suggesting that an officer must (or is expected to)
 meet a quota; or
- Offering a benefit to an officer based on the officer's quota
- Requires the Attorney General to establish a form for a police officer to use to report the use of quotas in violation of the above prohibitions, to investigate alleged violations, and to issue a cease and desist order if a violation is found.
- Allows a police officer to choose whether to submit the report anonymously or disclose his or her identity in the report.



FOP of Ohio adds first 2 members to the #ProtectOhioPolice Hall of Shame

The FOP named Cincinnati rabble rouser Iris Rowley its very first member of the Protect Ohio Police Hall of Shame. Rowley, an antipolice activist and city paid consultant, has been harassing officers for simply doing their job. Lodge 69 created an online petition calling for Rowley to have her consultant contract terminated. You can find it here: https://www.cincypolice.com

The FOP added Akron At-Large Councilman Eric Garrett to the "Hall of Shame" for undermining public safety in August.






